## Chief's Report

## Call Volume

- March Total Calls: 145 (18% higher over same month last year)
  - o Motor Vehicle Accidents (MVA): 9
  - o Emergency Medical Services (EMS): 98
  - o Fires: 28 (over 100 acres of wildland)
  - o Other: 10
- Trend: Wildland season has arrived early. Total call volume up 18% over same month last year)
- Significant fires: 80+ acres & and 22+ acres on border and 4 at same time.

## Personnel Updates & Training

- Captain Process: Lt. Sayers promoted to Captain, with an assigned vehicle to improve coverage.
- Lieutenant Process: Lt. Anderson filled the vacancy from the Lt. list, starting on the 18th. He is also the first career Paramedic in the department.
